Letter from the President

Dear PFLAG Friends,

We recently had a trans tragedy hit close to home. A few weeks ago our PFLAG chapter Information line had a message from the relative of a local 13-year-old trans female who had taken her life, leaving her family and friends bereft and confused. The family member who called us was looking for resources and support for herself and the family.

The next day, when I spoke with the caller, she told me the child had loving and supportive family all around her - that she couldn't have had more family support. But there had been bullying and torment at the child's school. Seemingly, too much for the child to withstand.

I provided support by phone and as many resources as I could find from our own website and with the help of another Board member. I wished the woman well and have been thinking about her, her family, and the deceased child ever since.



It's real. It happens. Sometimes distress and anguish is too much for a soul, especially a young soul, to withstand. Sometimes death seems like the only relief. Sometimes a person does feel that alone.

PFLAG is an organization known for caring and helping. The woman who called our information line KNEW it was a place to get help. We were able to provide her with other places to get help and assistance. I hope her family was able to make use of some of the resources.

We do good work. We do important work. We want to do the kind of work that reaches the suffering LGBTQ person BEFORE they find themselves in a place of despair. Let's keep at it.


Keep an Eye out for Two New Interview Podcasts Expected to Drop Soon !





This meeting is a forum for South Bay community leaders and federal prosecutors to discuss how hate crime and civil rights violations are affecting local communities and how federal law enforcement can help to address these problems. All are welcome.



"Gen Silent" Film Screening and Discussion

"Gen Silent" is a 70-minute, moving film that was released by Clowder Group in 2011. The film zooms in on the challenges that the LGBTQ community faces as they age, particularly when it comes to health care and supportive services. The discussion following the film screening will be led by non-profit Avenidas Rainbow Collective and focus on changes since the film was released and what leaders are saying the future looks like. Guest speaker, former Santa Clara County Supervisor Ken Yeager and author of "RUN" a book encouraging members of the LGBTQ community to run for public office – will also join the discussion. eQuality Collaborative Scholarship Opportunity Applications are Due January 31, 2024



The eQuality Scholarship Collaborative awards scholarships to honor and encourage California students for their service to the lesbian/gay/bisexual/transgender community.

Our PFLAG SAN Jose/Peninsular Chapter participates in this Collaborative and in 2023 granted seven scholarships.

Eligibility:

- In general, eligible students fall into one of these categories: Resident of northern or central California who completed or expects to complete high school or equivalent between 1 Jul 2019 and 30 Jun 2024;
- Resident of northern or central California who completed or expects to complete community college between 1 Jul 2019 and 30 Jun 2024;
- LGBT+ graduates of Oakland Unified School District high schools;
- Students pursuing a medical degree at an accredited medical school in California

Asexual Awareness

Ace Week

Ace Week (short for asexual) is an annual week of awareness and celebration. This year's 2023 Ace Week took place October 22 – 28.

What is asexuality?

Sometimes abbreviated as ace, the term refers to an individual who does not experience sexual attraction. Each asexual person experiences relationships, attraction, and arousal differently. Asexuality is distinct from chosen behavior such as celibacy or sexual abstinence; asexuality is a sexual orientation that does not necessarily define sexual behaviors. Asexual people exist on a spectrum of sexual attraction and can use terms such as gray asexual or gray ace to describe themselves. (From PFLAG National)

The flag has four colors: black, gray, white and purple. Black represents asexuality. Gray represents demisexuality and gray-asexuality. White represents allies and partners. Purple represents community. Those colors were chosen as the same ones that are part of AVEN's logo. (From Insti)
