

Letter from the new chapter president, Sara Larson



Hi! I'm the new president of the San Jose/Peninsula chapter of PFLAG. I am a stayat-home mother of a transgender son who lives with me, with my husband and my mother also in the same house. My daughter is in grad school in LA. In a multigenerational household, it can be hard to discuss LGBTQ issues frankly and openly. My son leads the way, talking about whatever is on his mind.

Lately, issues have included, how people's voices on the Discord app affect how they are perceived, how LGBTQ friends back in Florida are faring, and how much effort to put into maintaining relationships with family members we love, who are not LGBTQ affirming.

I came to PFLAG when I lived in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. It was one of two organizations I belonged to, in the early days after my son came out to me as transgender. One great thing about PFLAG meetings, is that they are for everybody.

Don't give up on creating change in your world, just because the world is big, and you are just one person. You are a person, and that means you matter. Know your worlh and do what you can to change your world.



Recent and Upcoming PFLAG San Jose/Peninsula Activity in the Community

My Two Different Years at LGBTQ+ Advocacy Day in Sacramento by Jessica Gachet

For two years now I have volunteered to be part of Equality California's LGBTQ+ Advocacy Day in Sacramento. As someone new to advocacy who has never before spoken to a politician, it has been a great way to learn and get involved. This year there were over 120 volunteers who learned about LGBTQ+ positive legislation in progress and broke into small groups to meet personally with the offices of over 90 lawmakers.

Each year that I attended, we focused on twelve pieces of priority state legislation (https://www.eqca.org/legislation/#). The volunteers, split in groups, shared our personal stories with lawmakers and asked for their support. After a long day, we got to listen to several legislators from California's Legislative LGBTQ Caucus talk to us about their years of experience and hope for our future, leading progress for all Americans.

Both years my experience was extremely educational and inspiring, but they were quite different. On my first Advocacy Day, I was in a group that happened to be assigned to talk mostly with very LGBTQ+ friendly legislators. Some of the legislators we met with were even part of the LGBTQ Caucus or had written the very bills we were asking them to support. It was very emotional and profound to hear everyone's stories, but compared to some other groups, ours was a cake walk! It was an easy way to get my feet wet.

This year, for my second LGBTQ+ Advocacy Day, I was put in a group that met with some legislators who were more politically conservative or even hostile to LGBTQ+ rights, so it was very different. One senator's staff even moved us out into the hallway and told us about violent threats their staff received warning them not to vote for LGBTQ+ positive legislation. But then there was also an assembly member who seemed cautious but met with us personally and really listened and even asked questions. I realized that we might not agree with everyone on everything, but by being there and sharing, we can help our legislators make better decisions for the people living in their districts.

I will definitely be attending again. If you want to learn more about legislation in California and get involved, I highly recommend it! You get to meet others working for LGBTQ+ rights in all parts of our state. As part of an energetic group, it is a way less scary first experience speaking directly to our representatives - and seeing a bit of how the sausage gets made. I hope you will join me next spring!



Tribute to Long-standing PFLAG Member, Marti Wright, written by her wife Kitty Trejo

Marti was born during the Depression, a fact that set her up to be strong willed from the get-go. She was the first of fraternal twins, and already had an older sister, so the first few years of life were a struggle for her parents. By the age of four, she knew she was different from her sisters, but had no words for it. They liked to play with dolls and other girls, whereas she liked playing with toy guns and boys. At the age of 14 she was such a good softball player that she was asked to join a women's team, which her parents allowed her to do. She discovered she loved being around strong active women!



To contribute financially to her family, she held several jobs during high school, working at Sunshine Biscuits on the conveyor line, then working first at a drive-in movie theater and later at the Fox Theater in downtown Oakland. The manager of the theater fell in love with her, and eventually asked her to marry him. In her family, marriage was considered the only way to exit the home, so she said yes. It was a platonic marriage apparently, during which she worked in San Francisco as a telephone operator and her husband worked in Fresno. They broke up by a mutual friendly agreement when Marti turned 21.

Before earning a bachelor degree in teaching from SF State, Marti did a stint in the US Marines, but was disappointed that she was only offered a role as chaplain or bookkeeper. She was living with a woman who owned horses, and Marti learned to train and ride horses. She also got inspired to go back to school and become a teacher. As a high school PE teacher, she knew she would have to be in the closet at work. Also, she decided to give the military another try, and joined the USN Reserve.

I met Marti towards the end of her careers as a teacher and a Navy reservist. It was 1993, and we moved in together about four months after meeting. I identified as bisexual, had two young adult children and had lived my life as a heterosexual. There was no way I was going into a closet! We joined PFLAG at the suggestion of one of Marti's long-time teaching friends.

Being around so many accepting people in PFLAG helped Marti to feel more comfortable about gradually coming out. We served as PFLAG librarians, joined the speaker's bureau and marched in parades. My children and grandchildren loved her as family, and she volunteered at the local schools as both a photographer and parking lot traffic supervisor. Many former students and faculty were delighted to find her on Facebook.

She was loved by many and is missed by many. Kitty
