A big shout out to all our members who wrote and showed up to the San Mateo Union High School District school board meeting on September 10th! The district's slight hesitation updating anti discrimination policy for LGBTQ+ students attracted attention from anti-trans activists who showed up to their meeting in August spreading misinformation and hate including some national figures who appeared virtually. We coordinated with other local orgs and teachers to write and show up at the next meeting and love louder! There were many moving statements and the trustees moved ahead with their vote, complying with state laws and education codes.

On October 10 one of our local members showed up with other allies to make public comments at the CIF (California Interscholastic Federation) meeting in Los Angeles to encourage their committee to comply with state laws and support inclusion of transgender kids in school sports. We were proud to be part of an amazing group delivering personal stories about how inclusion benefits everyone.

Year End Tax Tips for Charitable Giving.

What's new for 2025? What's new for 2026?

For the 2025 tax year there is no deduction for charitable contributions if you take the standard deduction. If you itemize you can deduct all of your charitable contributions, subject to the usual requirements. More people may itemize now that the SALT (state and local tax) limit has increased from 10k to 40k.

Starting with the 2026 tax year, charitable contributions of money are deductible for those taking the standard deduction. Single filers will be able to deduct up to \$1,000 and joint returns will be allowed up to \$2,000. (You might remember that they did this during COVID, but at a lower amount.) For those itemizing deductions, there will be a new threshold of charitable giving you must meet, before you can start deducting your contributions. Essentially, donations up to one-half of one percent of your AGI (adjusted gross income) will not be deductible. Multiply your AGI by .005 to see how much you won't be able to deduct next year if you itemize. Example: the first \$500 for an AGI of 100k.

Consult your tax adviser and don't let the tax tail wag your charitable donation dog.

If you are over 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ and have an IRA, you are qualify to make tax-free donations! A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) transfers money from your traditional IRA to a non-profit, without going into your income. It does not matter whether you currently have to take RMDs, as long as you are over age 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ at the time of the donation. But if you do have to take an RMD, your donation counts toward that amount. Check with your institution to see whether they'll send the money directly to the charity for you, or send you a check payable to the charity for you to send on.

We would be very grateful if you considered a separate donation to the scholarship fund.

Also, if you are making larger donation, please send a check to help avoid the credit card transaction fees, of almost 5%.
